- 2) Ensure you include both hard skills (Like "Excel Expert") and soft skills (Like "Flexible and welcomes change that improves company results"
- When listing "Studied Abroad": List what you learned from the experience; skills you gained (IE: Ability to quickly establish rapport, Ability to overcome obstacles.)

*CTRL+END-moves the cursor to the end of a document

*<mark>CTRL+Backspace</mark>-deletes entire words at a time vs. letters *<mark>CTRL+SHIFT+V-</mark>pastes everything you

*CTRL+SHIFT+V-pastes everything you copied without formatting it as plain text.

ALT+Tab-Switch between open apps
CTRL+W-Close program
CTRL+Z-Undoes any change


FUN INTERNATIONAL FACTS:
