


**How to Find Your Old
Military Buddies After
You Get Out**

While the government and military branches won't provide contact information for veterans or active-duty personnel except for official business, they do offer a lot of good starting points for locating people who served at various commands, including lists of reunions.

The Department of Veterans Affairs can forward a message to a veteran, providing the veteran has filed a claim with VA and their current address is on record.

The Army's SoldierForLife program offers a lot of helpful information for both retired and veteran

soldiers, including access to the magazine "Echoes."

Navy Retired Activities offers a wealth of information for retirees and veterans, as well as a link to reunions and access to the "Shift Colors" magazine.

Air Force Retiree Services has a website that provides several helpful links, including information about reunions as well as access to the "Afterburner" magazine for Air Force retirees.

The Marine Corps' "Leatherneck" magazine has links to unit reunions, as well as helpful information for retirees and veterans

The Coast Guard, United States Public Health Service and National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration have an official retiree magazine, the "Long Blue Line", for all three. It lists reunions, as well as more information for retirees.



Raising Your VA Compensation Rates

As the cost of living goes up, VA ensures that your benefit rates do too! Starting Jan. 1, 2023, all compensation benefit rates have increased by 8.7% to match adjustments made to Social Security benefits. This increase impacts disability benefits, clothing allowance, dependency and indemnity compensation (DIC), as well as other VA assistance programs. If you receive VA compensation benefits, learn your new rates today.

Track Your VA Claim

Since the PACT Act was signed into law, Veterans have set an all-time record for filing online disability compensation claims. VA will begin to process all PACT-related claims on Jan. 1, 2023. If you have a pending claim or appeal, use VA's online tool to stay up-to-date on its status.



Supplement Your Pension with Aid and Attendance

Did you know that VA's Aid and Attendance and Housebound benefits can increase your pension payments to support the additional care you need? If you need help with daily activities, or if you are housebound, you may qualify for an increased VA pension to help pay for in-home care, assisted living, or a nursing home.

Simplifying the Post-9/11 G.I. Bill application process

Applicants to receive an immediate decision after submitting application

For the first time in 78 years, G.I. Bill® applicants can receive an

immediate, real-time education benefits decision, thanks to the simplified Post-9/11 G.I. Bill application experience.

Since 1944, over 25 million beneficiaries have taken advantage of G.I. Bill benefits. Many of these individuals waited up to a month to receive an eligibility decision—a month of waiting to plan their future, a month of waiting to take the next step toward their educational goals. But not anymore, thanks to VA's most recent modernization updates, through the Digital G.I. Bill (DGIB) initiative.

VA made updates to its application process in August 2022, allowing eligible Veterans and service members to apply for and receive their Post-9/11 G.I. Bill benefits decision within minutes. The first Veteran to receive an automated decision was surprised and excited about the new process:

“I honestly didn't even realize the process had changed. It was so smooth and instantaneous!

I've already told a few of my friends who are out or getting out soon how easy the process was to apply for the Post-9/11 G.I. Bill and get the go ahead to apply for classes. I appreciate the efforts VA has made to ease the process for [Veterans]. The Post-9/11 G.I. Bill is basically an automatic benefit for those who serve out their contracts in the military and the process for applying may have been a deterrent in the past, but that was so easy! I hope this helps more [Veterans] utilize this benefit in the future!”

By simplifying the education benefits experience, VA is helping Veterans use the benefits they have earned and deserve. VA is making a difference in the lives of Veterans, their families, and the nation as a whole.

If you are a Veteran or service member who is ready to apply for VA education benefits, here's how to get started:

Go to the VA website at www.va.gov. Click the blue Sign in button at the top right of the page.

If you don't already have a VA.gov account, you will need to create one. You can create an account using ID.me or Login.gov. Pro tip: watch our video for easy step by step instructions on to create an account using ID.me.

After you have created your account, be sure to follow the prompts to verify your identity. This will provide you full access to VA.gov.

Once you have created your account and verified your identity, you're ready to apply for Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits!
