3.) Successful Project Management: Use Keywords, "Launched"" Evaluated"" Achieved",


Ex: "Collaborated with team to launch the relevant and engaging social media plans."

4.) Highly Flexible: Use Keywords, "Improvised"" Adapted"" Persuaded"



Thank you, Shonda for being such an asset to our MGA Cochran campus students and ISS department.




